Whereas, The lives of children and adults with disabilities are enriched through the work of direct support professionals; and,

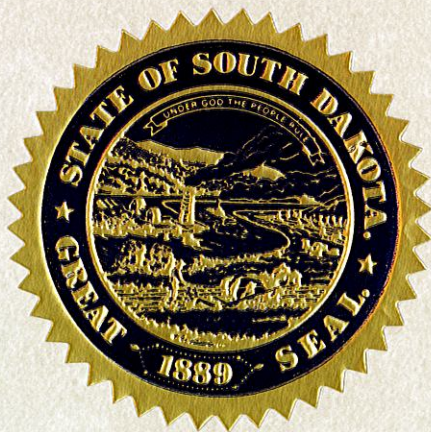
